(Tallahassee, FL) – Junior Achievement Big Bend (JA Big Bend), together with Leon County Schools, brings *JA Be Entrepreneurial* to Leon County high school classrooms which culminates with the countywide JA Big Bend Shark Bowl competition. The program introduces students to "thinking entrepreneurial" and teaches the essential components the Business Model Canvas. Engaging activities inspire students to develop unique ideas and introduces them to the possibility of starting their own business while teaching them the entrepreneurial skills they need to become more productive and innovative workers.

Research conducted by Junior Achievement USA and Survey Monkey shows that helping students link what they learn in school to life outside the classroom is one of the biggest challenges facing teachers and parents. JA programs are delivered by corporate and community volunteers who provide relevant, hands-on experiences which helps students apply entrepreneurial thinking to the workplace and become successful adults.
